Day 1

SANTIAGO - TEMUCO - VILLARRICA

After arriving in Santiago, connect to your flight to Temuco.

On arrival, our driver will be waiting to assist you with your luggage and transfer your party to Villa Lafquenko, our retreat on the shores of beautiful Lake Villarrica. On our way you will enjoy beautiful views of Chile's verdant and lush Lakes District.

To observe the total Eclipse of December 14, 2020, we have chosen a beautiful and comfortable location on the shores of Lake Villarrica, only 3 kilometers away of the City of Villarrica and 20 kilometers from Pucón. Villa Lafquenko meaning "Agua de Laguna" or lagoon water in the Mapuche native language. A private lakeside retreat located in the middle of the band of totality, immersed in a magical landscape of verdant temperate rain forest, deep blue lakes and rivers, snowcapped mountains and volcanoes, and the rich rural life of the renowned Lakes District of Chile. Within the property you will find a main house for up to 9 guests, a large guesthouse for up to 8 guests, and a cottage for up to 5 guests, all surrounded by a park and gorgeous gardens ensuring a relaxing stay in complete seclusion and privacy, ideal for families and small groups of friends. (Detailed architectural plans of each unit available.)

Upon arrival you will be transferred to your accommodation where you can spend the remainder of the day at leisure. Our vehicles will also be available to take guests to different drives to interesting and scenic points.

Day 2

VILLARRICA - PUCÓN

This morning, at a pre-arranged time we will visit the Lakeside city of Pucón. The hustle and bustle of the city of Pucón invites visitors to go for an intense and dynamic tour during the summertime. Its main streets and avenues are packed with excellent restaurants and recreational options.

O'Higgins Avenue, as well as Ansorena, Fresia, Palguín, Alderete, and Urrutia Streets are must see, to visit stores offering items such as handicrafts and food specialties. During summer, Fresia Street is open only for pedestrians and its restaurants set their tables on wooden terraces under multicolor umbrellas. Some points that we will visit in the city are a must visit and the main square is one of them, as its features and history have left a typical legacy.

Next, we will visit artisans that create gorgeous hand carved wooden flowers. Using few materials but tons of patience and good taste, the skills of the artists give life to roses, dahlias, daisies, and chrysanthemums. The materials they use are Chilean willow or wicker, a knife and a giant sharpener set on an electric lathe. All the raw materials are gathered directly by the artisans, who then condition it for the task. The rest depends on the agile movements of the hands shaping the wicker sticks and the wood shaving curls that come out of the lathe to make up the main body of the flowers.

It looks very simple but the craft has its secrets, only known by the artisan who easily puts together hundreds of flowers of different sizes and designs every day.

After this interesting visit we will drive back to our lodging to enjoy lunch overlooking the garden and the lake followed by a few hours at leisure prior to cocktails and dinner.

After dinner will join the group for an astronomy lecture covering general aspects of astronomy. Touching the subjects of astronomy history and specifics about identification of different celestial objects. Once the sky is dark, our astronomy expert and guides will show you how to use the different telescopes.

Day 3

VILLARRICA

After breakfast, a few hours before the eclipse, a noted astronomer will explain the eclipse phenomenon and its different stages.

The Eclipse: Experience the eclipse from a specially chosen viewing site at a private lakeside retreat located in the middle of the band of totality immersed in a landscape of pristine lakes, forests, snowcapped mountains, and the rural life of the renowned Lakes District of Chile. Today we will witness the total solar eclipse that will take place at approximately 13:00 hrs. In both Chile and Argentina, summer is the dry season, with the amount and frequency of rainfall well below the winter maximums.

We will have four telescopes for the party:

- 16" Dobsonian
- Coronado Solar
- 5" Maksutov with filter
- 10" Dobsonian with filter

Note on weather: If weather cooperates our first choice for viewing site in Chile will be the park on Villa Lafquenko set on the shores of Lake Villarrica, providing a clear view of the sky, within an open area of the park

away from the buildings, for maximum visibility of the eclipse. It is a private property, so access is limited only to our group.

In case weather reports indicate the sky will be overcast, on eclipse day, we will depart with the group very early in the morning (between 4:30 – 5:30 am for a two and a half hour drive) towards the Eastern side of the Andes in Argentina to a location in a semi-arid environment and higher altitude where viewing conditions are generally better. The higher reaches of the Argentine track, east of the Chilean border, offer incredibly attractive eclipse-viewing opportunities. The air is cool, the atmosphere pristine, pine forests add a scent and moisture, and towering Lanin Volcano with its snowy peak points the way east.

Immediately after the eclipse, you will also be treated to a delicious lunch prepared with local and fresh ingredients.

The partial eclipse will begin at 11:41:27 local time (14:41:27 GMT), at which time the sun will be at a height of 60 ° above the horizon.

At 13:03:19 LT (16:03:19) the total eclipse will begin.



Day 4

The expected time of the maximum eclipse (the moment in which the moon will cover the highest percentage of sun) will be 13:04:23 LT (16:04:23 GMT). At this time, the sun will be at a height of 72 ° and its azimuth will be 30 °. The moon will cover 102.5% of the sun.

The total eclipse will end at 13:05:27 LT (16:05:27 GMT). The duration of the total eclipse will be 2m 08s.

The eclipse will end at 14:31:33 LT (17:31:33 GMT) at which time it will no longer be visible from Pucón. The height of the sun at the end will be 71 ° above the horizon.

After lunch, enjoy the rest of the afternoon at leisure. If returning from Argentina, drivers will not be available for further transfers due to necessary resting time.

Please note: Although we have developed alternatives to ensure Eclipse viewing conditions are the best, viewing the eclipse will be always weather dependent. Since we have no control over the weather, there is always a chance that we will not be able to view the eclipse or only for a short period of time. Your Pionero Travel director will keep you fully informed of any changes to viewing the eclipse and any other planned activity while on tour. A sense of humor, flexibility and patience will be greatly appreciated during this program and especially on eclipse day!

VILLARRICA - FLOR DEL LAGO

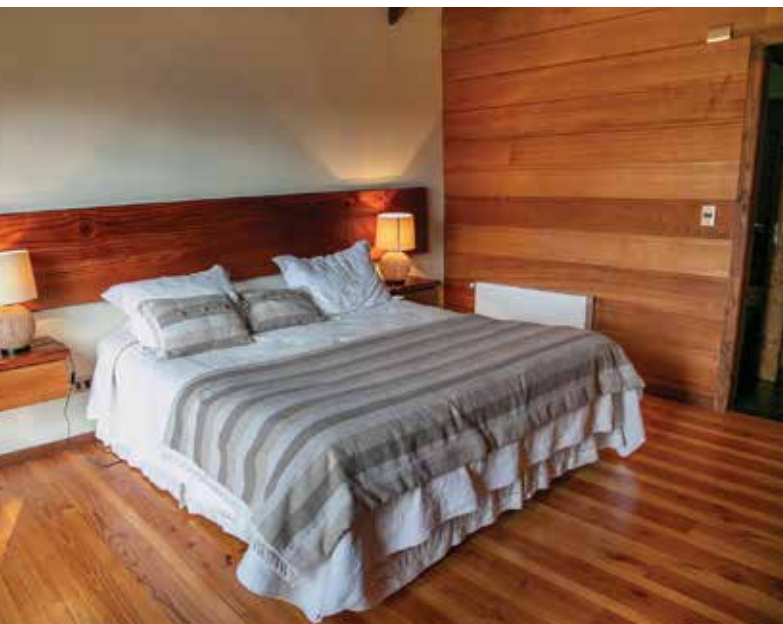
During the morning, our vehicles will take the group to Flor del Lago, a nearby estate. Flor de Lago will open its doors exclusively to members of our group. "Flor del Lago", meaning, "flower of the lake", is a 7,000-acre private estate situated on the shores of Lake Villarrica. Owned by the Wagner family for three generations, farming and forestry remain the principal businesses to this day. Its unique setting provides complete privacy with spectacular views of the lake and the active Villarrica Volcano.

Beautifully manicured fields and forests planted as early as 1939, is testimony to the success and hard work of this German-Austrian family. There are beautiful gardens that shelter many different horticultural collections with antique and prize specimens. A rare 270-hectare virgin rainforest with numerous trails permits a glimpse of what the region was like before the arrival of European settlers. You will enjoy strolling through its gorgeous grounds and if you are interested, longer and more active hikes through the beautiful farm with magical views of forests, fields, mountains against the deep blue Villarrica Lake.

After your activity and freshening up, we will join our hosts and fellow group members for a delicious lunch with beautiful vistas of the Villarrica Lake.

From there you will return to the starting point where you will be transported back to your accommodation in Villarrica.

Day 5

VILLARRICA - TEMUCO - SANTIAGO

Today at a pre-arranged time, a Pionero guide and driver will meet you at your hotel and escort you to Temuco's airport and assist you with check-in with your departing flight to Santiago.

Today, upon arrival to Santiago's airport, a Pionero guide and driver will await you outside of the arrival terminal with a sign with your last name on it. They will escort you to your hotel and assist you with check-in.

Note: International and domestic arrivals to Santiago - your meeting point will be at the arrivals hall after exiting baggage claim, between doors 3 and 4 in front of LeFournil Café & Restaurant. Domestic arrivals to other Chilean airports, you will be met outside of baggage claim at the arrival hall.

The Singular Santiago combines the style of early 20th century buildings with neoclassical French architectural influences. The result is a striking new addition to the Santiago cityscape.

Everywhere you go in this Santiago hotel, you will experience yet another pleasant surprise. The endlessly indulgent spa. The superlative dining experience at the Singular Restaurant. The dazzling views and refreshing cocktails in the ninth floor Sky Bar. Step out onto the elevated terrace, and you are treated to a spectacular view: the Forestal Park, an arboreal escape right alongside the hotel, and enjoy the rooftop swimming pool.

The hotel is not only bounded by natural beauty, though; Lastarria is the epicenter of the arts here in Santiago. Walk just a few minutes, and you can discover some of the finest visual and performance art Chile has to offer at The Museum of Fine Arts, The Museum of Visual Arts, the Gabriela Mistral Center and more.

Day 6

SANTIAGO - CALAMA - SAN PEDRO

Today, you will be picked up at your hotel and escorted to the Santiago airport and assisted with check in for your flight to Calama.

Upon arrival to Calama's airport, a Pionero guide and driver will await you outside of the arrival terminal with a sign with your last name on it. They will escort you to your hotel and assist you with check-in.

Boasting modern design interiors and an outdoor swimming pool, Altiplanico Atacama features splendid views of the scenery from every angle. There is free Wi-Fi in public areas. Altiplanico Atacama has minimalistic-inspired architecture and is styled with natural fabrics. Rooms feature panoramic terraces and private bathrooms with showers. A full breakfast with regional products can be enjoyed daily and there is an on-site restaurant.

At a pre-arranged time in the evening, you will be picked up at your hotel. We will ascend about 1,000 meters until we reach the village of Talabre where we will walk through Kezala, one of the canyons that connect the high mountains of the Andes with the basin of the Atacama Salt Flat and it preserves an invaluable archaeological heritage in the form of rock paintings. While sunset approaches, we will head to Chile's biggest salt flat to marvel at its geography and its unique ecosystem where we can spot Flamingos, amongst other birds. After our visit, you will be dropped off at your hotel.

Day 7

SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA

This morning after breakfast, you will be picked up at your hotel and we travel south, going up to the puna (highlands) to marvel at its unique vegetation, wildlife, lagoons, and salt flats. Here, Miscanti Lagoon - the largest lagoon in the Antofagasta region - is certainly the one that impresses travelers most. We also visit the village Socaire, where the indigenous community still preserves part of the traditional Atacamenian lifestyle.

We leave San Pedro in the morning and drive south, passing by the Atacama Salt Flat and the villages Toconao and Socaire, we will get to the lagoons Miscanti and Meñiques which - administrated by the indigenous community of Socaire together with CONAF (National Forest Corporation) - form part of the Flamingo National Reserve and are located at 4,350 and 4,100 meters respectively. They are magnificent reserves of crystal-clear water that impress with their intense blue color. Surrounded by a mountainous backdrop marked by the volcanoes Miscanti and Meñiques, the lagoons are the natural habitat of many rare and beautiful birds, including Chilean Flamingos, Puna Flamingos, Baird's Sandpipers and Horned Coots amongst other species. This visit will allow you to genuinely enjoy the overwhelming solitude and peace of this sanctuary of nature.

We continue our journey towards Socaire, a village at 3,300 m.a.s.l. with around 360 inhabitants who traditionally work in agriculture, cattle-breeding, wool hand-craft, mining industry and of late also in tourism. Here we will have lunch at the 'Guest House' (Casa de



Huéspedes), a treasure of the indigenous community of Socaire. (Lunch included.)

After lunch, we will get to know the village's traditional agricultural system in more detail, as well as the manufacturing process of wool. The agricultural land is arranged in the form of terraces. Remarkable is the cultivation of some peculiar products like horse beans or purple potatoes that only grow in this area. Over the last few years, the craft production of fine textiles made of alpaca, llama, or sheep wool - a process which starts with the breeding of the animals - has increased. The 'Weavers of Socaire' (Tejedoras de Socaire) sell their products mainly in a local store. Apart from that they receive orders from retail and private parties all over Chile.

The origin of Socaire's church dates to the colonial era. Of special beauty is the picturesque bell tower which is built on cut stone and adobe milled from the local region.

After your visit, you will be dropped off at your hotel.

Day 8

SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA

Today at a pre-arranged time in the early morning you will be picked up at your hotel. We will begin with breakfast as we enjoy the serene magic and beauty of the sunrise in the Salt Mountain Range. We visit the impressive landscapes of the Moon Valley. We explore two Ayllus of San Pedro and taste typical Atacamenian food. We get to know the history, culture, and challenges of San Pedro de Atacama.

We will go through the Salt Mountain Range where we observe a spectacular geological phenomenon. Being composed of huge deposits of salt, gypsum and reddish clay, this mountain range depicts a landscape full of natural sculptures. Here we can find magnificent grottos with stalactites, pointy ridges, a landscape of a unique morphology and an impressive view over the Atacama Salt Flat and the volcanoes of the region.

The Moon Valley, in the middle of the Salt Mountain Range, is an area of sculptural rock formations whose salinity abounds at the surface, covering the landscape in a white coating, as if it were the surface of the moon. Between dunes and rock formations of crystallized gypsum appear small hills and sharp ridges in which the erosion has created diverse figures whose forms change dramatically according to the angle of the sun. The valley forms part of the National Reserve Los Flamencos (CONAF) and is administrated by the indigenous communities of Coyo, San Pedro, Quito, Séquito, Larache and Yaye.

We will take advantage of the early hours around sunrise, when the silence makes it possible to hear the salt crack and the subtle morning light allows us to walk along empty trails – getting to know this magnificent place and observing its impressive formations in detail.

We continue our way towards the Ayllus, the name given to old social units of the Likan Antai or Atacamenian culture where several families lived together in agro-pastoral communities created by lineage and descendants. Today, this kind of territorial organization represents rather a geographic delimitation, but the narrow and mazy labyrinth-like alleyways live on, surrounded by cultivatable lands with gardens, big native trees, irrigation canals and old adobe houses largely still inhabited by descendants of the Likan Antai culture, which now belong to the Atacamenian communities. We will savor some typical flavors of the desert and highlands with a

tasting prepared by an Atacamanian family, using fresh, organic ingredients from their vegetable garden. After this, head back to your hotel and you can enjoy some free time.

In the evening you will be picked up at your hotel, experience the night in the Atacama Desert, its infinite sky, the fire and the stories gives life to a unique and unrepeatable sensory experience with a balanced level of knowle-



dge of the Andean cosmovision of the sky and the scientific and formal language of the stars. Sip on a hot drink or some cocktails as you stargaze.

Your guide will combine the traditional scientific astronomy with the ancient Andean vision the first astronomers had in this place, long before the first telescope was used. We observe the beauty and solemnity of celestial bodies in a unique environment: in the middle of the driest desert of the world.



The Atacama Desert has one of the most star-spangled skies in the world which can be observed thanks to the extraordinary diaphanousness of the desert air. In the Andean culture, astronomy is essential in the daily life of their agropastoral societies, and it integrates and influences their architecture, art, music, and dances. To get even closer to the ancient experience, we will sit around the fire to share the stories, myths and legends related to heaven, in the way that the locals did. This activity offers gazing the night sky with the naked eye, recognizing constellations, or admiring the moon to interpret and share modern and ancient knowledge. As a complement, we will also have the possibility of observing the stars and the moon through the modern telescope.

The worldview of the habitants of the Andes is closely related to the firmament, which reflects the life on earth and the transcendent life of the spirits. To this day, the Yatiris and Amautas (wise men of the Andean cultures) follow their traditions in accordance with the movements in the sky, and especially in relation to the movement of the Milky Way. There they find representations of most of the most important animals of their cosmovision and the daily life of the habitants of the Andes, such as the llama, tinamou, toad, snake, and sheep. This way, the movement of the constellations has shown for thousands of years – and to this day – the right moment to seed, harvest, celebrate, entreat, thank, and pay homage to the defunct. Like this, the sky provides the Andean man the necessary knowledge to live in this difficult desertic environment, as much regarding the agricultural activity as the spiritual rituality, both of which are always closely related to each.

The observation of the stars has momentousness so much bigger than mere observation.

Note that this tour can be cancelled in case of a very cloudy day and you can rearrange your tour or get refunded, except from the booking fee.

It is especially important to consider that during moonlit nights the possibility of gazing planets and stars decreases considerably. Especially on full moon nights very few stellar objects can be gazed, nonetheless you can experience the incomparable brightness of the moon in the desert.

After observing the night's sky, you will be dropped off at your hotel.

SAN PEDRO DE ATACAMA

Today you will be picked up from your hotel early in the morning. You will be provided with breakfast. Witness the sunrise as we head towards one of the entries to the Andean highlands, passing through important altitude ecosystems of extremely rich biodiversity such as the wetlands of Machuca and Putana. We make a stop at Machuca, a little farmer's village, to then continue towards an overwhelming spectacle of nature: the geyser field El Tatio. Before returning to San Pedro we explore yet another mighty gift of the earth, known as the Geyser Blanco (White Geyser), where the ones who have the heart can get into the thermal waters in the middle of the river trough.

While most of the visitors go very early to see the sunrise at the geysers, we leave San Pedro de Atacama with the rise of the sun in order to make the whole tour an unforgettable experience: seeing the beautiful landscapes on the way up; getting to know Machuca in an authentic and quiet way – before the arrival of hundreds of tourists; enjoying the geothermal fields in all their solemnity and tranquility while observing the fauna that walks between the geysers, being able to observe attentively and without freezing temperatures the overwhelming natural phenomena.

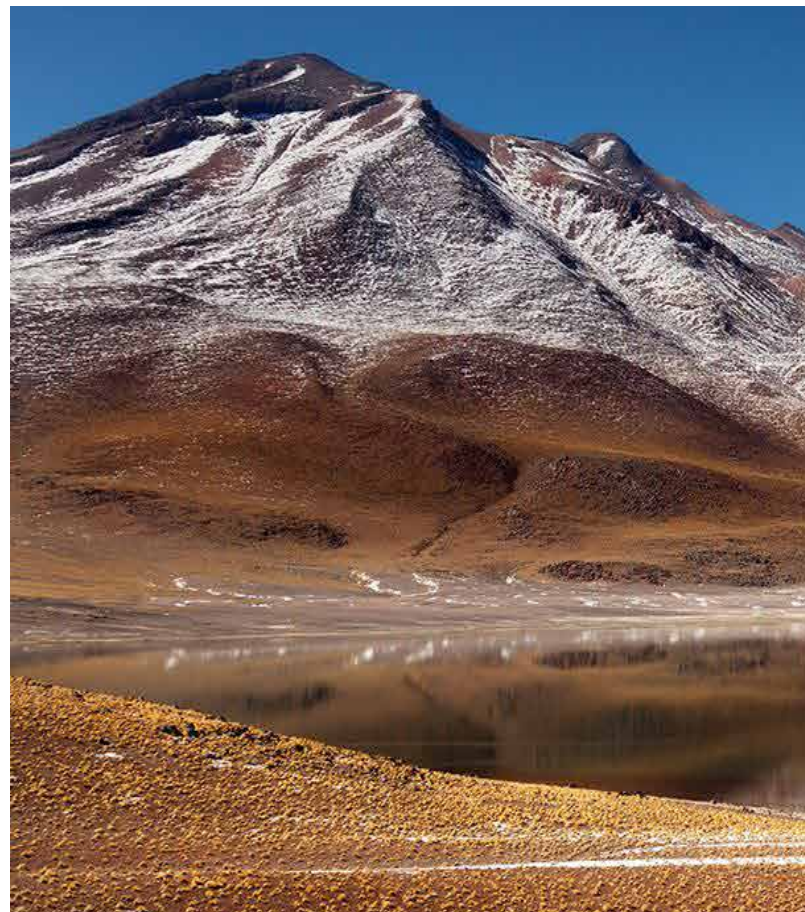
Machuca is a small village at 4,000 masl whose few inhabitants still maintain the tradition of cattle breeding. For this reason, during a few hours every day we can see herds of llamas and sheep grazing in the wetlands around Machuca, amongst wild Vicuñas and a rich avifauna. Machuca's constructions of stone, adobe, and straw transport us back to past times, when the village was inhabited by a considerably larger community. Towering over the village, the church and bell tower hold ready for us yet another universe full of symbolism, which can be better understood each 25th of July. That day most of the machuqueños come back to their village to gather and celebrate their patron Saint Santiago.

Putana Wetlands lies around 4,300 masl, right at the entrance to the altiplano and with an active volcano of the same name that completes the panorama, the Putana river widens – thus giving life to one of the most important ecosystems of these high lands: “bofedales” (highland wetlands). Formed by several interweaved micro canals of water and a dense vegetation dominated by “Paja brava” (Peruvian feathergrass), the wetlands are the source of life in the cordillera. Even pumas and other

species with vulnerable conservation status foregather here to find food and water. The Putana wetland stretches across kilometers also receiving a great number of birds. Its waters continue downstream until, together with other contributors, giving life to the San Pedro River. Very few places offer such an ample and outstanding view of the highlands like this one.

Seventy-seven kms northeast of San Pedro, the intense volcanic activity of the region becomes evident in the form of vigorous thermal manifestations known as geysers. It was the indigenous people of these lands who named this geothermal field “Tatio”, a Kunza word that breaks down into tata-iu, the crying grandfather.

The phenomenon is caused by the contact of water, penetrating the cordillera, with a subterranean complex of hot rocks that are a product of the magmatic activity of this sector. The matutinal cold (around -10°C) generates high condensation which produces fumaroles that can rise to 10 meters with fascinating colors between the nebulas. The ground is soft and often brittle due to the water that flows beneath. Because of that one must be careful when walking over the fields. There is a thermal pool suitable

for bathing (54°C) from where it is possible to observe and admire the spectacle of the geysers.

The geysers at El Tatio at 4,300 masl are some of the highest in the world and are administered by the indigenous communities of Caspana and Toconce.

Embedded at the bottom of a canyon only minutes away from the Tatio geysers, the White Geyser is a sector where water from springs, creeks, and the subsoil confluence. All of them have different temperatures, from the coldest to some that are at boiling point but mixed they form a thermal river where having a bath is highly recommendable. The whitish colors of the formation are due to a strong mineralization at the surface, deposited by numerous springs of boiling water.

Before entering the water, it is necessary to check the water temperature, since it can vary depending on the time of the year.

After your tour, you will be dropped off at your hotel.

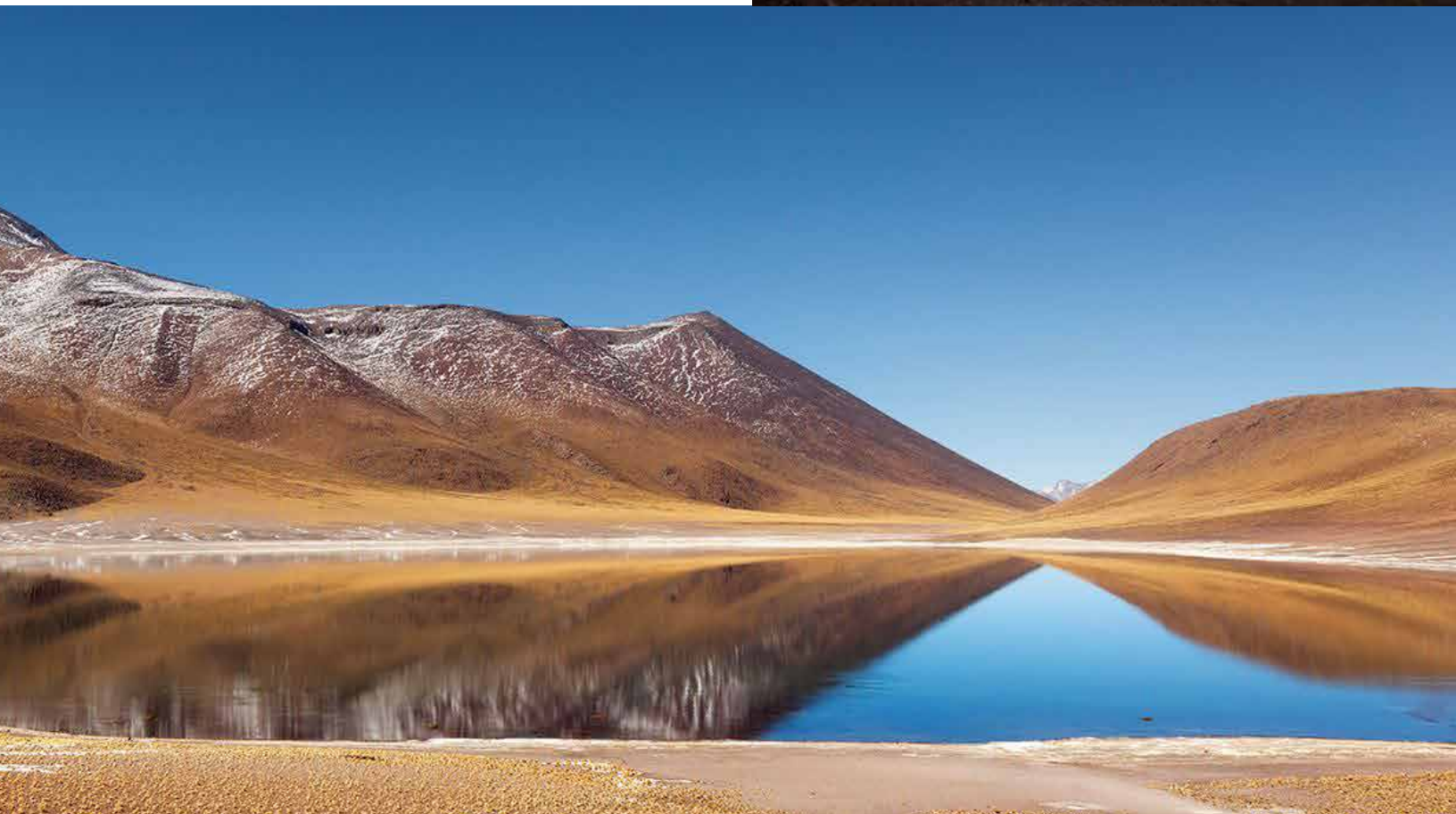

This protocol is based on currently available information and will be updated as soon as new information is available.

This document has been prepared by Pionero Travel, gathering information from national and international organizations. This initiative arises as a response to the need for having a risk management manual to prevent the COVID 19 contagion, while producing a document that may be of use to our partners, providers, employees, and travelers helping to establish official protocols in this matter.

General Travel

- Collaborate with our providers to establish a common protocol and precautions to put in place.
- Set flexible terms and conditions and make sure our providers do the same so we can make changes or postponements at the convenience of the travelers and avoid high fees and clearly communicate this to the travelers.
- Travel insurance is highly recommended.
- Design programs that combine destinations that are easily and quickly accessible by land minimizing air travel within a country or area. Example: Araucania & Lake District combining with Argentine side, Coast/Wine/Central Valley, Self-drive itineraries.
- Promote remote locations with low population and traveller densities with a focus on the outdoors, culinary and intimate cultural experiences.

Air Travel

- Use “Salon Protocolo” or “VIP Arrivals areas” these are exclusive areas of airports generally used for international arrivals and departures limiting contact between passengers, crew and airport personnel.
- Online check in is mandatory
- Arrival at the airport 2.5 hrs. prior to departure
- Use the counter only for luggage check-in
- Obligatory security and health check and reduced group boarding will be in place.
- Sky Airlines has announced the following:
 - The central seat between passengers will be free every two rows will disembark at a time to maintain social distancing.
 - Daily rigorous disinfecting and renewing the cabin air every 3 minutes will take place on the plane.
 - They will use HEPA filters to eliminate 99% of microscopic particles.

Hotels & All – Inclusive Lodges

- Use boutique hotels that have committed to protocols against COVID-19 like this one.
- In case client has requested an all — inclusive lodge with a shared program instead of our private programs, we suggest private programs at Awa, Hangaroa, Awasi, Alto Atacama, among others that have established protocols against Covid-19

Tours & Activities

- Equipment is to be understood as any element provided to the client for his/her own use during the tour as well as the communitarian equipment, which is also under the same protocol. The equipment is to be sanitized according to the protocols of the Ministry of Health (MINSAL) regarding disinfection.
- Any personal equipment is to be of use solely by each client and properly identified (helmet, harness, ice axe, binoculars, bicycles, oars, etc.). For the communitarian use (i.e., telescopes) each client will have a cleaning and disinfecting kit that they will use to clean such equipment after use before handing it down to another client.
- Regarding the use of common areas in state-protected wild areas, protocols produced by CONAF (National Forest and Protected Areas Services) are to be followed and in the case of using natural areas where there are no hygienic services or facilities of the sort, the Leave No Trace guidelines are to be used which will have to be explained by the guide in charge of the activity during the safety briefing.

Drivers & Guides

- Guides and drivers always need to use masks. Provide masks, hand sanitizers, and plastic gloves for travelers in the van and try to maintain when possible a 2 m / 6.5 ft distance from the travelers.
- The guide is to deliver to the client the information, restrictions, and care to be aware of during the tour when the activity starts. Risk management briefing is to take place before getting on the transport vehicle, in an open space and has to include: the double check of the client’s personal protection equipment (mask or facial protector), the proper way to sneeze, cough or yawn, encouragement the practice of not touching one’s face with the hands and taking the temperature of each client, the guide and the driver, action that is to be done properly in plain sight of the clients.
- The guide is to be aware to keep the group away from other visitors and of not to use the same resting places.
- The guide is to make sure that the interaction with people foreign to the tour is limited to the minimum. Minimize visits

to places where many people are gathering like restaurants, museums, funiculars , etc.

Transportation

- Clients and staff must wash their hands using hand sanitizer or soap and water every time that they get on the vehicle.
- Clients also must wear a health mask during the transportation or during any time spent inside the vehicle.
- All vehicles used for transportation of travelers during day tours or multi-day tours should be disinfected prior each departure, during the tour and after every day of use. The disinfection will be made by Pionero Travel staff or the transportation company in case the service is provided by a vendor. During the tour, the disinfection will be properly executed by the driver. Pionero Travel will be in charge of a proper training for drivers for an accurate and efficient cleaning operation and will have a monitoring journal with date, time and person in charge of each of this operation.
- The vehicle will be used with a 60% of its capacity always leaving a seat empty beside or in front of every client in case client clients has booked a shared service. This protocol will not apply (except if it is requested) for couples, family members or group of friends traveling together.
- Seat rotation will not be suggested during a tour except after the daily disinfection procedure. This suggestion will not apply for couples, family members or group of friends traveling together.
- Any personal item of the client and staff should be placed in their own seat or space taking care that personal objects are always under the control of the owner.
- Circulation of air in the vehicles will be especially important. Drivers must be aware of always allow the external circulation of air and keep the vehicle always well ventilated.
- For other means of transport, such as ferries and boats, specific protocols will apply, all of them according to the Health Minister directions.
- Check and enforce the correct use of means of transport according to existing regulations of National Health authority in relation to the number of clients per vehicle and disinfecting protocols before, during and after its use. Rotation of seat during transportation will not be allowed, except for members of the same family groups or couples.

Food & Restaurants

- Providing a private picnic lunch at a park etc. (or upgraded box lunch)
- For boxed lunches, food will be sealed and individually distributed. Each client is to transport their own food thus preventing manipulation by a third party. Food will be individual, and clients are not to share either food or utensils. Waste generated by each client during the activity is to be handled only and exclusively by them until reaching a place they can be disposed of. To such effect, personal containers will be provided for collecting garbage.
- In the case of local vendors for food, it will be responsibility of the company to check and make sure the proper protocols for handling and manipulation of food according to the regulations of health authorities. Regarding food in gastronomic establishments protocols from health authorities are to be enforced, being company responsibility to check that such establishments fulfill sanitary and hygiene conditions.

General Recommendations for Travelers

- To accept and to follow all protocols indicated by the guide and the company.
- To respect the recommended minimum distance of 2m /6 feet with other clients, with the guide and other people during the activity, unless the people in question are members of the same family group.
- To bring his/her own bottle of water, his/her own mask and his/her own sanitizer, gel or other method of disinfection, regardless of the fact that the provider in charge of the activity will have extras if needed.
- The client is to accept, in case of presenting any of the symptoms of COVID 19, not to participate in the programmed activity to look after his/her own, the staff and the other client's health. Participants in close contact with the person with potential symptoms are to avoid participation in the activity as well.
- The client can demand to know and be given access to the company's contagion prevention plan at any given time.
